The old NG Church – 28°10'45.9"S 23°33'01.3"E
Under the leadership of Rev JW Meyer, the church was built of dolomite stone in 1894-6, under the leadership of Rev JW Meyer.

Old Post Office – 28°10'54.2"S 23°32'47.6"E
The first post office in Danielskuil, built in the 1890s; now a Guest House.

Idwala Lime Mine – 28°12'02.2"S 23°32'55.1"E
This was established in 1975. It quarries high-grade limestone.

OLIFANTSHOEK

Olifantshoek town – 27°56'38.89"S 22°44'10.21"E
The town originated as a white trading settlement. The first white person to settle in Olifantshoek itself was the trader Cecil Spyrin, in 1895. The first brick buildings in Olifantshoek were built in 1906 – a police cell and magistrate's office. Those were the days when police patrols were done on camels!

Kaapvaal Craton – 27°56'38.89"S 22°44'10.21"E
Turnoff to Alte Fijn Coffee Shop
Langberg was the western edge of the Kaapvaal Craton, an ancient continent, 3 billion years ago. Cratons are blocks of ancient lava crust. The other half of the Kaapvaal Craton is in Western Australia - It moved away due to continental drift.

Little elephant – 27°56'42.66"S 22°44'8.61"E A little statue of an elephant recalls the original Twana name of the Olifantshoek area – Ditlou, the place of the elephant.

GRIQUATOWN

Andries Waterboer Grave – The Griqua state emerged in the course of the 1820s and 1830s after Andries Waterboer, united the Griqua in 1819. He died in 1852.

Mary Moffat Museum – 28°50'52.16"S 23°15'5.20"E
This house was built by Rev Anderson in 1805. Robert and Mary Moffat moved into the house in 1819, and little Mary Moffat was born here on 12 April 1821.

The Execution Tree – 27°33'27.41"S 23°28'32.11"E
Andries Waterboer initiated conducted raids against Bergenaar brigands in the Langberg. The large execution tree was one of six sringa trees planted by DH van Zyl in 1803. Six key Bergenaar leaders were executed here at 4 pm on May 16, 1827.

Klaarwater Fountain – -28.857624, 23.249550
Two early missionaries, William Anderson and Cornelius Kramer, established a mission station at the Klaarwater Fountain, in 1804.

NG Church, Griquatown – 28°50'54.4"S 23°15'19.1"E
The NG Church in Griquatown was established in 1881. The first church was built in 1882; then rebuilt in 1895. The church was enlarged in 1943.

CAMPBELL

Bartlett church and Livingstone tree – 28°48'5.61"S 23°43'15.28"E
Rev John Bartlett settled here in 1825. He built a mission church in 1831. Bartlett died in 1849.

Campbell – 28°48'5.61"S 23°43'15.28"E

The Griqua leader, Adam Kok I, settled here in 1811. In 1813, the missionary-traveller John Campbell visited the place, and it was named after him. In 1816, old Cornelis Kok and his Griqua following settled here, and Rev Campbell established a mission station in 1820.

NG Church, Campbell – -28.797190 23.713951
This church was built in the 1940s. The congregation was later joined to the NG church in Douglas.

DEBEN

NG Church – 27°35'48.1"S 22°52'36.2"E
Several white families settled here before the Anglo Boer War. The first Dutch Reformed church was built in 1917, and serviced a vast area, including Kuruman

Doringdraad Bar – 27°35'47.7"S 22°52'48.1"E
Old shopping area, now the vibrant Doringdraad Bar.
